4. What are your chapter's values, and what do those mean to you?
5. What kinds of things do you do with other chapter members?
6. What are some words you would use to describe your chapter's sisterhood?
7. How does your chapter support you?
8. How does your chapter empower you?
9. What is the time commitment of your community like?
10. What are the leadership opportunities of your chapter like?

## Round 2: Philanthropy and Finances

1. How important is service and/or philanthropy to your chapter, and why?
2. What does your chapter's philanthropy or your chapter's service mean to you?
3. What kind of philanthropic or service events and activities do you do?
4. What do dues go towards?
5. What kind of dues scholarships are members of your chapter eligible for?
